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ARTICULATION AGREEMENT**BETWEEN****UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-PLATTEVILLE****AND**

Madison Area Technical College d.b.a. Madison College

This Agreement is entered into between Madison College, Madison, WI, and the University of Wisconsin-Platteville, WI. This Agreement and any amendments and supplements shall be interpreted pursuant to the guidelines set forth in the UW System Administrative Policy 135 (formerly ACIS 6.0) and UW System Administrative Policy 140 (formerly ACIS 6.2). Both institutions agree to maintain accreditation by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and any other accreditation currently in existence pertaining to degree programs articulated via the transfer agreement.

Admission and Graduation Requirements Specific to this Agreement:**

- a. UW-Platteville's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- b. Students must complete the entire A.A. degree.
- c. Students must fulfill graduation requirements at both institutions.
- d. Students will be required to earn a minimum of 32 credits in residence at UW-Platteville with at least 23 of the last 32 credits in residence.
- e. General admission to UW-Platteville requires students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0, however; to be admitted to the School of Education, a 2.750 cumulative GPA or higher is required from Madison College.
- f. A cumulative, professional, and major GPA of 2.750 is required to graduate at UW-Platteville as an education major. In addition, technology & engineering education students must have passed the technology education Praxis Subject Test or have a major GPA of 3.00.

II. Transfer of Credits

- a. Students wishing to transfer to UW-Platteville after completing the Associate of Arts – Liberal Arts Transfer Education Pre-Major are guaranteed admission to the Technology Education major within the Department of Industrial Studies given that all admission requirements are met.
 - Submit an application to the university by the established application deadline, prior to attending UW-Platteville.
 - The application needs to include all School of Education admission requirements:

- a transcript to verify 30 credits and grades are earned or in-progress, complete a background check through Castle Branch, and complete the required essays.
 - “C” or better is ENGL 1130, ENGL 1230, SPEECH course, MATH 1620 or above general education course, TCHG 1230, & TCHG 2130 or Psychology equivalent. See Appendix A for suggested course pathway.
 - Provide a letter of recommendation from a Madison College faculty member.
- b. A transfer pathway table illustrating the list of courses the student must complete to earn the Bachelor of Science degree in [Technology Education](#) at UW - Platteville; course/credit requirements fulfilled at Madison College; and courses the student must take at UW-Platteville may be found in Appendix A.
- c. Additional coursework completed at Madison College may be transferrable to satisfy UW - Platteville general education or breadth requirements. These courses are listed in Appendix A or are searchable through Transferology (<https://www.transferology.com>) or through College Source’s Transfer Evaluation System (TES) <https://www.uwplatt.edu/admission/transfer-credits> .
- d. Elective courses taken or substituted at the Madison College not listed in this agreement will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and determined how they may apply to the degree at UW-Platteville.

III. Additional Provisions

- a. Retention Policy: Each semester following admission, a mid-semester review of all students will be completed by faculty/instructional academic staff (IAS) teaching the professional courses. In the event there are concerns with a teacher candidate, these concerns and goals for improvement will be shared with the teacher candidate or possible recommendation for dismissal.
- b. The University of Wisconsin-Platteville’s teacher education programs are designed to meet the education requirements of professional licensure by the Department of Public Instruction in Wisconsin. The programs may not meet requirements from other states. We are unable to make a determination about whether or our programs will lead to licensure in other states. Before beginning any academic program that leads to licensure, UW-Platteville strongly recommends that you contact the appropriate state licensing board where you wish to seek licensure to determine whether the program you are considering will meet that state’s teacher education licensing requirements.

IV. Implementation and Review

- a. The Provost, Dean, School Director/Department Chair/Program Coordinator or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- b. The University of Wisconsin-Platteville and Madison College will provide academic advising to the Madison College’s students inquiring about UW-Platteville’s programs. Madison College will assist UW-Platteville in arranging recruitment events on its campus.

- c. Any marketing of this agreement will be subject to the prior approval of both parties and will adhere to each institution’s standards for the use of its name and logo. Each institution may provide a link to this agreement on its website, only after notifying the other party.
- d. Both parties agree that failure to maintain accreditation will be grounds for termination of this agreement.
- e. This Articulation Agreement is effective on 06/2023 and shall remain in effect until the end date of 06/2026 or for three years, whichever occurs first, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice. OR This Articulation Agreement remains in effect unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- f. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- g. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning 01/2026 (within six months of the end date).
- h. When a student enrolls at the receiving institution following this agreement, the receiving institution will encode any course waivers and substitutions.
